This month's question: 'Are Zoos ethical?'

Points for Yes:

- Educational purposes
- Rehabilitation able to save endangered species
- Life span of an animal in captivity is longer than in the wild
- Zoos are the best option for helping animals after the damage we have done to their habitats

Points for No:

- There is a difference between sanctuaries and zoos

Active Essex – Tom Weller and Lee Monk:

The #MovewithUs campaign aims to get people – in particular young people and children – moving around Greater Essex.

They asked what barriers prevent Children and Young people getting active:

- School work/revision
- Financial situations

- Body image and social stereotypes
- Not enough motivation

'How can we break these barriers?'

- Information on the activities and clubs in the local area
- Making people aware of free activities
- Group activities
- Vary PE lessons

YC Members were given the opportunity to become #MovewithUs ambassadors

Marine Parade Greening Project – Councillor Maxine Sadza:

This will be the first large scale Water Management Project in Southend.

A presentation was delivered to members on the plans in place to prevent damage from rising sea levels in the future, as the current storm drains aren't strong or frequent enough along the parade. This plan will cost around £2 billion, and aims to provide new green space and safety from erosion and flooding etc
